This is a lecture-only course and there is no lab component.

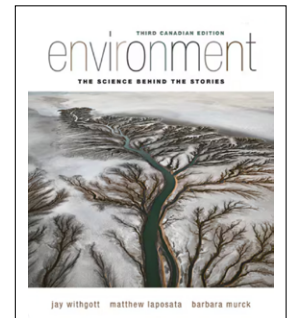
